Dr Jan Franeker is head of research at Texel and Dan Turner is the North East England co-ordinator of "The Save the North Sea" Fulmar project. The project is a collaborative effort between all countries surrounding the North Sea. It draws attention to the damage caused by 20,000 tons of litter dumped every year in the North Sea.

The campaign characterised birds of the North Sea as turning into "living dustbins", with 96 per cent of fulmars having plastic in their stomachs. "Save the North Sea" also worked with a group of fishermen in Scotland to cut the amount of marine litter and clean up the sea.
